Describe the four apparitions in Macbeth in act 4, scene 1 ...

This tells Macbeth that he cannot be harmed by anyone born of a woman, so Macbeth doesn't fear Macduff (However, we learn later on that Macduff was a C-section baby and 'was from his mother's womb untimely ripped').The irony is that all the prophecies given by the apparitions are double-edged and turn against Macbeth. The prophecies are also ambiguous and the witches use equivocation to ...
